The gases that make Saturn are very, very cold, so the temperature is –180°C. It's much colder than anywhere on our planet and only Neptune is colder in our solar system. Saturn is famous for its thousands of beautiful rings, which are ice. We know a lot about Saturn because in 1979 a spacecraft, Pioneer 11, visited Saturn and took lots of photos. Saturn has got about 60 moons. This is more than any other planet.
